Note for the directions.

The principal's office is near in the main gate. First, walk straight towards the main building. Next, turn left when you get to the corner. Then, walk straight, at the end you will see an arrow sign pointing to the gate. Finally, next to that arrow sign is the Principal's office.

Old Man:	Thank you.
Rome:	You're welcome.

What words did Rome use to make his directions clear?



Think!

The words first, next, then, and finally are called **signal words**.

Writing directions are not only used in locating places. There are also directions in preparing things that need to be done correctly.

Study the sentences.

- 1. Prepare 2 cups of rice.
- 2. Put the rice in a pot
- 3. Wash the rice once without rubbing the grains.
- 4. Add 2 cups of water.
- 5. Cover the pot, place it over the fire until the rice boils and cook.


