





## What I Need to Know

Welcome to another lesson in English 2. In this module, you will be learning some specific parts of a book. Learning each part of a book is as important as the knowledge we can get from reading it. Understanding each part will help you use the book in a much more meaningful manner.

As you go through this lesson, you will learn how to identify the title, author and book illustrator and tell what they do.

#### Parts of the Book



#### What is it

A book has many parts. But you will only focus on its parts that are found on the books' cover page which you have learned from the song. The three parts of a book that you have learned are the title, author and illustrator.

Study the cover of a book below to find out where these three parts are located.



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Now let's discuss what these three parts of a book do.

- > The <u>title</u> tells what the story is or it is the name of the book. In the example above, the title of the book is "A Friend from the Star".
- The <u>author</u> is the one who writes the words. In the picture above, the author is "Edward C. Sison".
- The <u>illustrator</u> is the person who makes/ draws the pictures that go with the words. In the picture above the illustrator is "Janos D. Malce".


