This time you will learn more about the use of this/that, these/those.


Look at the pictures. Listen as your parent/guardian read the sentences.

Picture 2, shows that there are more than one car and near to the speaker we used the pronoun <u>THESE</u>.


Picture 3, shows that the boy is pointing to one house and the house is away from the speaker so we used the pronoun <u>THAT.</u>






What I Can Do
